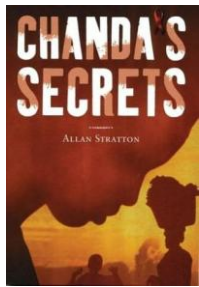

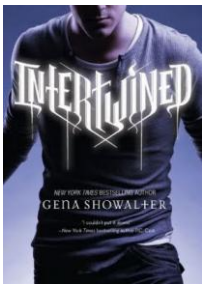
Across from the Universe by Beth Revis

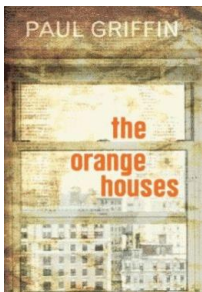
Chanda's Secret by Allan Stratton

Follow three teens through the pressure cooker of inner-city teenage life.



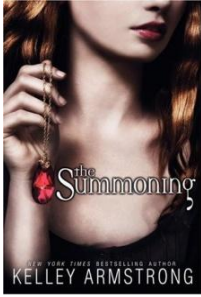
Revolution by Jennifer Donnelly

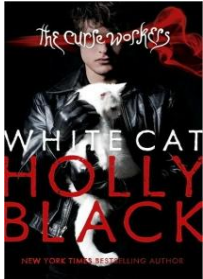
The Summer I Turned Pretty by Jenny Han

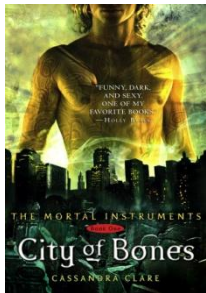
Chloe, 15, sees dead people, but does not yet realize she has this unusual ability.



***White Cat* by Holly Black**

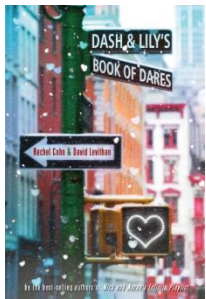

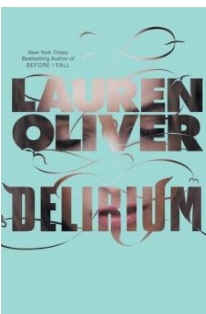
***City of Bones* by Cassandra Clare**

Clary witnesses a fight at a nightclub; the problem is that she is the only one who can see these beings fighting.



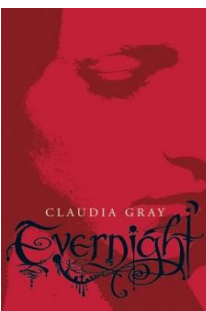
***Dash and Lily's Book of Dares* by Rachel Cohn and David Levithan**

Dash and Lily, 16, find themselves on their own in Manhattan at Christmas. What will they do with all that free time?



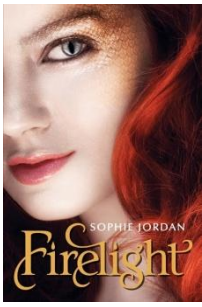
***Delirium* by Lauren Oliver**

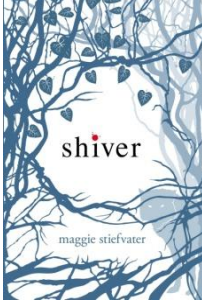
***Evernight* by Claudia Gray**

A modern Romeo and Juliet story, where vampires and humans are at war.



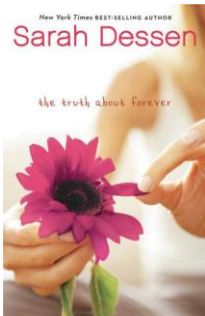
Firelight by Sophie Jordan

Shiver by Maggie Stiefvater

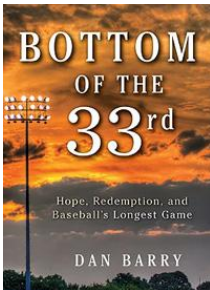
Grace loves the peace and tranquility of her woods and her new pet wolf. The funny thing is this wolf has the same color of eyes as the boy she likes.



The Truth about Forever by Sarah Dessen

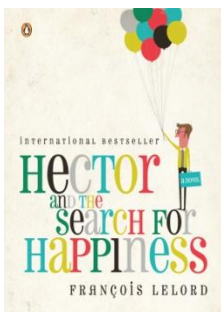

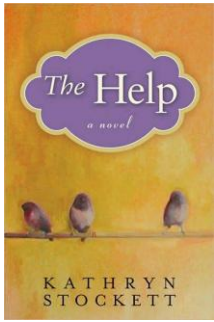
Bottom of the 33rd: Hope, Redemption, and Baseball's Longest Game by Dan Barry

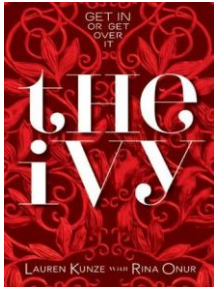
Hector and the Search for Happiness by François Lelord

Travel around the world with a psychiatrist named Hector as he attempts to understand what makes people happy.



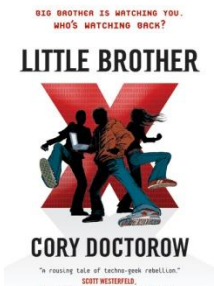
The Help by Kathryn Stockett

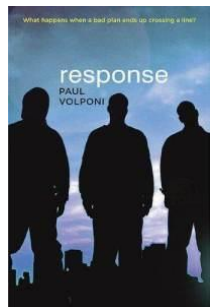
The Ivy by Lauren Kunze

Callie certainly doesn't have the money, the connections, or the right clothes. Will her intelligence and beauty be enough to help her survive freshman year at Harvard?



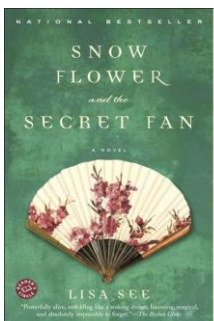
Little Brother by Cory Doctorow

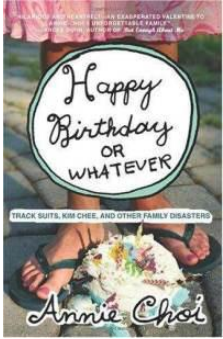

Snow Flower and the Secret Fan by Lisa See

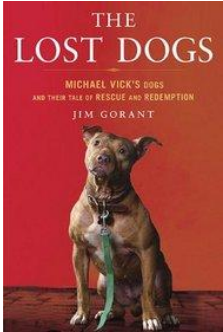
Set in remote 19th-century China, a deeply affecting story of lifelong, intimate friends who live in a world where women have no say.

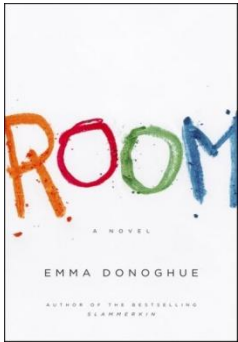
Happy Birthday or Whatever: Track Suits, Kim Chee, and Other Family Disasters by Annie Choi

An uproariously funny memoir of growing up with her Korean American family in Los Angeles.



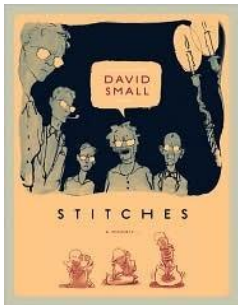
The Lost Dogs: Michael Vick's Dogs and Their Tale of Rescue and Redemption by Jim Gorant

A chilling investigation into Michael Vick's dog-fighting operation and the men and women who brought him to justice and rehabilitated the rescued dogs.



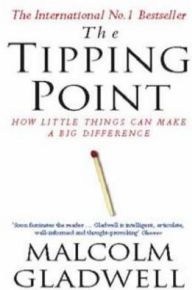
Room by Emma Donoghue

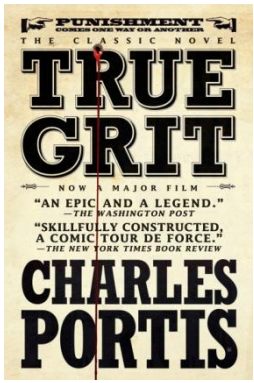
Stitches: A Memoir by David Small (Graphic Novel)
